

# Advice from Sarah Keeping your dog calm

#### Sarah's advice

DRUE's professional canine behaviourist and independent dog assessor, Sarah Hursthouse (from Dogskool) gives us some advice on keeping your dog calm.

#### Want a calmer dog?

A tired dog is a happy dog—but physical exercise alone isn't enough. Just like people, dogs need mental stimulation to stay balanced, prevent boredom, and reduce unwanted behaviours like chewing, barking, or digging. Enrichment activities provide opportunities for dogs to engage their senses, practice natural instincts, and work their brains as well as their bodies.

Below are some practical and fun enrichment ideas you can try at home to keep your dog busy and mentally satisfied.

#### 1. Food Enrichment

Dogs are natural problemsolvers when it comes to finding food. Turning mealtime into a challenge can help them slow down, focus, and engage their senses.

 Puzzle Feeders & Snuffle Mats: These encourage dogs to sniff, paw, and nudge to get their kibble.

- DIY Food Games: Hide treats in rolled-up towels, cardboard boxes, or muffin tins covered with tennis balls.
- Frozen Treats: Stuff a Kong or similar toy with wet food, cream cheese, pate, baby food, peanut butter (xylitol-free), or yogurt and freeze it. It takes longer to eat and provides soothing comfort.
- 2. Scent Work & Nose Games
  A dog's sense of smell is
  incredibly powerful—engaging it
  provides deep mental
  satisfaction.
- Hide-and-Seek: Hide treats around the house or yard and let your dog sniff them out.
- Scent Trails: Drag a treat or toy along the floor, leaving a trail for your dog to follow.



 Scent Work Kits: Some trainers sell kits with specific scents (like birch or clove) to teach formal nose work.

#### 3. Interactive Play

Playtime isn't just for exercise it's a bonding experience and a mental challenge.

• Fetch with a Twist: Ask for a command (sit, down, or spin) before throwing the ball.

 Tug-of-War: Great for releasing energy, but practice rules like "drop it" for safety.



 Training Games: Combine play with obedience training to sharpen focus.

# **4. Training & Trick Learning**Learning keeps your dog's brain active and strengthens your bond.

- Basic Obedience Refresh:
   Practicing "stay," "come," or "heel" is always useful.
- Trick Training: Teach fun skills like "shake," "roll over," or "spin."
- Agility or Obstacle Courses:
   Set up jumps, tunnels, or
   balance beams using items from around the house.






# Advice from Sarah Keeping your dog calm

- **5. Chewing & Licking Outlets**Dogs have a natural urge to chew and lick—it relieves stress and occupies their minds.
- Safe Chew Toys: Rotating between nylon bones, rubber toys, or natural chews (like bully sticks) prevents boredom.
- Lick Mats: Spread soft food on a textured mat; licking helps calm anxious pups.

#### 6. Outdoor Enrichment



Fresh air provides a wealth of mental stimulation.

 "Sniff Walks": Instead of a brisk pace, let your dog take their time to sniff. It's like reading the neighbourhood news.



- New Environments: Take walks in different areas for novel sights and smells.
- Dog Sports: Try flyball, agility, dock diving, or tracking for a structured challenge.

#### 7. Independent Play

Dogs also benefit from selfdirected activities that keep them busy when you can't engage directly.

- Rotating Toys: Keep only a few out at a time and rotate weekly to make old toys feel new.
- Stuffed Toys: Hide small treats inside plush toys or puzzle balls.
- Doggy Playdates or Daycare:
   Social interaction provides
   enrichment beyond toys.



#### **Final Thoughts**

Enrichment is about giving dogs opportunities to think, explore, and express natural behaviours. Even a few minutes of sniffing, problem-solving, or learning something new can tire them out more than a long walk alone.

A mentally stimulated dog is often calmer, happier, and more connected to their family. By weaving these activities into daily life, you can create a routine that nurtures both your dog's body and mind, helping them thrive as the curious, intelligent companions they were born to be.

### **Settling your adopted Dobie**

# THE 3 DAYS, 3 WEEKS, 3 MONTHS RULE OF ADOPTING A RESCUE DOG

THIS IS A GENERAL GUIDELINE, EVERY DOG IS UNIQUE AND WILL ADJUST TO THEIR NEW ENVIRONMENT DIFFERENTLY

#### IN THE FIRST 3 DAYS

Overwhelmed with their new surroundings. Not comfortable enough to be themself.
Reluctance to eat or drink. May shut down and curl up in their bed, crate or in a
corner. May be stressed, scared and not know what is happening. May try to test you
to see what they can get away with.

#### **AFTER 3 WEEKS**

Starting to settle in, feeling more comfortable, and realising this really may be their forever home. They're figuring out their environment and getting into the routine that you have set. Now they may start showing their real personality. Behavioural issues may start showing, this is your time to ensure boundaries are in place and you show them what is right and wrong.

#### **AFTER 3 MONTHS**

Now completely comfortable in their home. You have built trust and a bond with your dog, which gives them a complete sense of security with you. They are set in their routine and will come to expect the routine to continue
